CHRISTIANITY: Jesus is the door to heaven: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep—I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved—I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. (John 10:7–11)

CATHOLICISM: "Are You Saved? A Catholic Response to a Common Protestant Question," The Coming Home

Network, 07/05/17. "Salvation in the fullest sense is an ongoing process that won't be complete until after we die—We could choose someday to jump overboard—

We still have-the-ability-to turn away from God again—Simply believing in Jesus isn't enough—Faith is useless, then, without good works." —Paul Thigpen (CCC-162; 1459)

CHRISTIANITY: Salvation and Assurance, come from Scripture and the indwelling Comforter the Holy Spirit. "Our gospel came not unto you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Ghost, and in much assurance." (1 Thess. 1:5) "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God." (Rom 8:16) Good works are useless before saving faith. "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags." (Isa. 64:6) "Not of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them." [Without good works your faith is useless in glorifying God and leading souls to Christ. if they had known its necessity."

The **Christian** response would be that God would send the seeker a witness to preach the Gospel to them so that they could explicitly believe on Jesus the Christ as their Saviour. This is another example as to how **the gates of hell have prevailed against** Catholicism because they are not preaching the saving gospel of Christ's death, burial and resurrection but are instead preaching salvation through the sacrament of Baptism.

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"He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a ROCK: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a ROCK. But he that heareth, and doeth not—the ruin of that house was great." (Luke 6:47–49; Matt. 7:24–27) (See also Rom. 9:33; 1 Pet. 2:6–8)

**Jesus:** "But whom say ye that I am? And Simon Peter answered and said, *Thou art the* **CHRIST**, *the Son of the living God.* And Jesus answered and said unto him, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven. And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and *upon this* **ROCK** *I will build my church*; and **the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.** And I will give unto thee the **keys** of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. Then charged he his disciples that they should *tell no man that he was Jesus the* **CHRIST."** (Matt. 16:15–20)

CATHOLICISM: "Baptism is birth into the new life in Christ—it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism." / "Baptism indeed is the seal of eternal life." / "The Church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth." / "It is by faith in the Gospel and Baptism that one renounces evil and gains salvation that is the forgiveness of all sins and the gift of the new life." (CCC-1277, 1274, 1250, 1427)

<u>CHRISTIANITY:</u> A Believer's water baptism comes after they have been saved. Immersion represents the new Christian's faith in Jesus's payment for the debt of their sin, baptism pictures Jesus's death, burial, and resurrection. The new life or being born again comes through the baptism and sealing of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit's baptism comes immediately at the moment of saving faith in CHRIST as Saviour and Lord. If needed, to "achieve the holiness necessary to enter heaven" Purgatory provides the final cleansing.
