A. ... God preserved the Blessed Virgin from all stain of original sin. The Church speaks of this fact in the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception.

By grace the Virgin lived a sinless life. Therefore, at the end of her life on earth, she would not be subject to death as we know it. Her Assumption necessarily followed from the Immaculate Conception.

... the dogma of the Assumption, like the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, is not a doctrine the Church proposes simply on the grounds that it can be deduced in some irrefutable way from Scripture.

... the reality of Mary's **assumption into heaven** with the doctrinal authority given to the ***successor of St. Peter in Pope Pius XII's** <u>1950</u> apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus.*

... Gradually through the centuries the Holy Spirit unfolded in the mind of the Church the significance of our Blessed Mother's presence with her divine Son, King of Heaven, as His and our Queen Mother. The doctrine of Her coronation simply recognizes our Blessed Mother's exalted status in heaven.

*... (The Assumption and the Coronation) were reaffirmed by the fathers of the Second Vatican Council in Lumen Gentium (No. 59).

Jesus and His Family. The Gospel of Mark: "His mother and his brothers arrived. Standing

outside they sent word to Him and called Him. A crowd seated around Him told Him, 'Your mother and your brothers [and your sisters] are outside asking for you.' But He said to them in reply, 'Who are my mother and [My] brothers?' And looking around at those seated in the circle He said, 'Here are My mother and My brothers. **[For]** whoever does the will of God is <u>My brother and sister and mother</u>." Mark 3:31-35.

Bible footnotes:

3:20-35 Within the narrative of the coming of Jesus' relatives (20-21) is inserted the account of the unbelieving scribes from Jerusalem who attributed Jesus' power over demons to Beelzebub (22-30); ... There were those even among the relatives of Jesus who disbelieved and regarded Jesus as *out of His mind* (21). Against this background, Jesus is informed of the arrival of His mother and brothers [and sisters] (32). He responds by showing that not family ties but doing God's will (35) is decisive in the kingdom; cf the note on Mt. 12:46-50.

... the point of the story is the same in both gospels:

Natural kinship with Jesus counts for nothing; only one who does the will of His heavenly Father belongs to His true family.

3:32 *Your brothers:* see the note on Mk. 6:3.

The question of meaning here would not have arisen but for the faith of the church in Mary's perpetual virginity.
