SAVE YOUR SOUL

1. Receive regularly the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist.
2. Say your morning and evening prayers. Make acts of Faith, Hope and Charity every day; at night, before retiring, examine your Conscience and make an act of Contrition.
3. Attend Mass on all Sundays and Holy-days of Obligation.
4. If there exist any Church Societies in your parish, join at least one of them.
5. It is an obligation binding under sin to Contribute to the support of the Church.
6. You are obliged to avoid the occasions of sin; an occasion of sin is any person, place or thing which will likely lead you into sin.
7. Practice Daily Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Ask for her intercession, particularly for the grace of a Happy Death.
8. Remember: Death---Judgment---Heaven---Hell, and you will persevere unto the end.

Those who wear it practice a special devotion to Mary... In addition, **the person has a special entrustment of themselves to Mary for their salvation**. This, in fact, has been promised to those who faithfully wear the scapular: **‘Those who die wearing this scapular shall not suffer eternal fire.’** This must...be understood...in light of Catholic teaching that perseverance in faith, hope and love are required for salvation. The scapular is a powerful reminder of this Christian obligation and of Mary’s promise to help **those consecrated to her obtain the grace of final perseverance**.

Practicing Catholics declining

1A “ ...Rev. Thomas Dorn of the Fort Recovery Cluster Parishes.

‘**A practicing Catholic** is a person who goes to **church every Sunday** and **holy day**, goes to **Confession at least once per year** and **believes and practices** the teachings of **the faith**,’ Dorn said.”

10A “It’s important to remember that though the Archdiocese is seeking to welcome back non-practicing Catholics, **the church can never compromise its teaching.**

‘**Which**, as the teaching of Christ, **is eternal and unchanging**,’ Dorn said. ‘Catholic Christianity is a religion, not a social club. As such, **a Catholic must be “all in”** in regard to teaching of the faith, **lest that person be a hypocrite.**”

Basically or Briefly: {“**The Catholic Gospel is:** Jesus died on the Cross shedding His blood and opening the gates of Heaven and now through the Catholic Church one may enter heaven by **Explicitly (knowingly)** or Implicitly (**implied**) following or obeying the Catholic Church. Those who Explicitly follow or obey are **attending Mass** on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. Are **participating in** (The Eucharist & Confession) and have **received** the appropriate **sacraments** (been born again and had their sins cleansed away through water baptism), Are **doing good works**, Are having **devotions to Mary** and will have their final sin cleansing before entering heaven (if necessary) in **purgatory**. Those who are **Implicitly (implied that they would have had they known it was necessary)** following or obeying the Catholic Church are those who are **obeying their God or Religion** according to their beliefs so that on the day of their death they **will receive implicitly** the benefits of the Roman Catholic **sacrament of baptism** and will enter **purgatory** for their final cleansing.” Gary Westgerdes www.thekeysofheaven.com }
