According to Vatican II's Dogmatic Constitution on Divine

Revelation,

and sacred scripture make up a single sacred deposit of the word of God, which is entrusted to the Church. By adherring to it, the entire holy people, united to its pastors, remains always faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the brotherhood, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.'
