### Jesus, The Prophesied Savior

#### "Who has <sup>(th)</sup> believed our report? And to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed?

**The Prophet Isaiah wrote in 739–681 B.C.):** "For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: **he has** <sup>(th)</sup> no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. **He is** despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief: and **we hid** as it were our faces from him; **he was** despised, and **we esteemed** him not. Surely, **he has** <sup>(th)</sup> borne our griefs and carried our sorrows: yet **we did** esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But **he was** wounded for our transgressions, **he was** bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of **our peace** was upon him; and with **his** stripes **we** are healed.

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD has <sup>(th)</sup> laid on him the iniquity of us all.

"He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he opens (eth) not his mouth. He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? For he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he has (th) put him to grief: when you (thou) shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. He shall see of the travail of his soul and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore, will I divide him a portion with the great, and **he shall** divide the spoil with the strong; because **he has** (th) poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors." (Isa. 53:1–12)

# Jesus, The Crucified Savior "THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS.

"And one of the malefactors which were hanged railed on him, saying, If you <sup>(thou)</sup> be Christ, save thyself and us. But the other answering rebuked him, saying, **(1)** <sup>(Dost not thou)</sup> Do you not fear God, seeing you <sup>(thou)</sup> are <sup>(t)</sup> in the same condemnation? And we indeed justly; **(2)** for we receive the due reward of our deeds: but this man has <sup>(th)</sup> done nothing amiss. And he said unto **(3)** Jesus, Lord, remember me when you <sup>(thou)</sup> come <sup>(st)</sup> into your <sup>(thy)</sup> kingdom. And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto you <sup>(thee)</sup>, **(4)** Today shalt you <sup>(thou)</sup> be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:38–43)

"For **we** preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake." (2 Cor. 4:5) "But **we** preach Christ crucified—Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God." (1 Cor. 1:23–24)

# Jesus, The Rock

Perhaps, unknowingly, the wise malefactor's comments point to Jesus as the ROCK upon which the Church would be built.

"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever" (Heb. 13:8).

The wise malefactor's comments, and the parallel Old Testament Scriptures.

(1) "(Dost not thou) Do you not fear God?"

"For, who is God, save the LORD? And who is a **ROCK**, save our God." (Psalm 22:23)

(2) "For we receive the due reward for our deeds: but this man has <sup>(th)</sup> done nothing wrong / sinful <sup>(amiss)</sup>."

> "To show <sup>(e)</sup> that the LORD is upright: he is my **ROCK**, and there is no unrighteousness in him." (Ps. 92:15) "He is the **ROCK**, his work is perfect: for all his ways are judgment: A God of truth and without iniquity, just and right is he." (Deut 32:4)

"When he (Jesus) **saw their faith,** he said unto him, Man, **thy sins are forgiven** you <sup>(thee)</sup>." (Luke 5:20)

# (3) "Jesus, remember me when you <sup>(thou)</sup> come <sup>(st)</sup> into your <sup>(thy)</sup> Kingdom."

"Deliver me in your <sup>(thy)</sup> righteousness and cause me to escape, incline thine ear unto me, and save me. Be, you <sup>(thou)</sup> my strong habitation, whereunto I may continually resort: Thou hast given commandment to save me; for thou art my **ROCK** and my fortress." (Ps. 71:2–3) "Unto thee will I cry, O LORD my **ROCK;** be not silent to me: lest, if thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit." (Psalm 28:1)

(4) Jesus's response: "Today shalt you <sup>(thou)</sup> be with me in paradise."

# These scriptures reveal the joy the wise malefactor must have experienced that day.

"The LORD lives (th); and blessed be my ROCK; and exalted be the God of the ROCK of my salvation." (2 Sam. 22:47) "The LORD is my ROCK, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust." (Ps. 18:2) "O Come, let us sing unto the LORD: let us make a joyful noise to the **ROCK** of our salvation. Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving and make a joyful noise unto him with psalms. For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods ... O Come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the LORD our maker. For he is our God: and we are the people of **his** pasture, and the sheep of his hand." (Psalm 95:1–3, 6–7)

# Jesus, Our Creator

Written by Moses, approx. 1445 BC: "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth—And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them." (Gen 1:1, 26–27)

Written by Apostle John, approx. 85–90 AD: "In the beginning was the Word (Jesus), and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life; and the life was the light of men—He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not—

"As many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that **believe on his name:** Which were **born,** not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but **of God.** 

"And the **Word was made flesh**, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth grace and truth came by **Jesus Christ."** (John 1:1–4, 10, 12–14, 17)

## Jesus Our Friend

"If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. Jesus said: "Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much **fruit**; so, shall ye be my disciples. As the Father has <sup>(th)</sup> **loved** me, so have I **loved** you: continue ye in my love. If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full. This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have **loved** you. Greater **love** has <sup>(th)</sup> no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you. Henceforth I call you not servants; for the servant knows <sup>(eth)</sup> not what his lord does <sup>(th)</sup>: but I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you. Ye have not chosen me, but I have **chosen** you, and **ordained** you, that ye should go and **bring forth** fruit, and that your fruit should **remain**: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you. These things I command you, that ye love one another—But when the Comforter is come, whom I will send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceeds (eth) from the Father, he shall testify of me: And ye also shall bear witness,

because ye have been with me from the beginning." (John 15:7–17; 26–27)

### Jesus, Our Protector

**Apostle Paul wrote:** "But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived. But **continue you** <sup>(thou)</sup> **in** the things which you <sup>(thou)</sup> have <sup>(st)</sup> learned and have <sup>(st)</sup> been assured of, knowing of whom you <sup>(thou)</sup> have <sup>(st)</sup> learned them; And that from a child you <sup>(thou)</sup> have <sup>(st)</sup> known **the holy scriptures**, which are able to make you <sup>(thee)</sup> **wise unto salvation through faith** which is **in Christ Jesus.** All scripture is **given by inspiration of God**, and is **profitable for doctrine**, for **reproof**, for **correction**, for **instruction** in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all **good works.**" (2 Tim 3:13–17)

### Jesus, Our "White—ousness!"

"These are they which came out of great tribulation, and have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb." (Rev 7:14)

"For **God** so loved the world, that he **gave** his only begotten Son, that **whosoever believes** <sup>(th)</sup> in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

"But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that comes <sup>(th)</sup> to God must believe that he is, and that **He is a Rewarder of them that Diligently Seek Him.**" (Heb 11:6)

**Jesus,** "I am the **light** of the world: he that follows <sup>(eth)</sup> me shall not walk in darkness but shall have the **light** of life—\*As long as I am in the world, I am the **light** of the world—believe in the **light**, that ye may be the children of **light.**" (John 8:12; 9:5; 12:36)

Paul, "The Lord commanded us, saying,
\*I have set you <sup>(thee)</sup> to be a light of the Gentiles,
That you <sup>(thou)</sup> should <sup>(est)</sup> be for salvation
unto the ends of the earth." (Acts 13:47)

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Apostle Paul to the Christians – Followers of Jesus "Beware and fear that <sup>(lest)</sup> any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not

after Christ. For in him dwells <sup>(eth)</sup> all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.

"And ye are complete in him, which is the head of all principality and power: In whom also ye are circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, in putting off the body of the sins of the flesh by the circumcision of Christ: Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who has <sup>(th)</sup> raised him from the dead. And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, has (th) he quickened together with him, having forgiven you all trespasses; Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross; And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a show <sup>(e)</sup> of them openly, triumphing over them in it." (Col. 2:8–15)

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
